December 2: Serge Seiden, Ted van Griethuysen To Discuss Richard Nelson's *The Apple Family Plays*

Footlights is pleased to welcome back Studio Theatre's **Serge Seiden** – he is directing *The Apple Family Plays* – and actor **Ted van Griethuysen** to our **Monday, December 2** dinner-discussion at Alfio's. Longtime Footlights member Dorothy Marschak will moderate our discussion.

Playwright Richard Nelson is familiar to Footlights as the Tony Award-winning playwright/adaptor of *James Joyce's The Dead*. He has now written a series of four plays – one each year since 2010 – about the fictional, liberal Apple family of Rhinebeck, NY. From New York's Public Theater: "The compelling plays are about family, politics, change, and the way we live today. They resonate with remarkable immediacy and relevance. Each of these plays originally premiered on the night on which it is set.

In *That Hopey Changey Thing*, the Apples reflect on the state of their family and discuss memory, manners and politics as polls close on mid-term election night 2010 and a groundswell of conservative sentiment flips Congress on its head. In *Sweet and Sad*, a family brunch stirs up discussions of loss, remembrance and a decade of change."

Alfio's Trattoria is located at 4515 Willard Avenue, Chevy Chase, Maryland, on the ground floor of the Willoughby Apartments, a short walk from the north entrance of the Friendship Heights metro stop on the red line. Street parking is limited if you drive, but valet parking is free at Alfio's. Dinner is at 6:30; the discussion begins at 7:30 and ends at 9.

The all-inclusive cost for dinner and discussion is \$20. Dinner is a green salad, choice among six entrées, and spaghetti, green beans, bread and butter, ice cream, and tea or coffee. Alfio's salad bar may be substituted for the entrée if you wish. Cash or check – no credit cards, please. Wine, beer, and cocktails are available from the bar. You may come for the discussion only for just \$5.
