Insurrection: Holding History

On <u>Tuesday</u>, February 13, we will discuss *Insurrection: Holding History* by Robert O'Hara. *Insurrection: Holding History* follows Ron Porter, a young gay African-American graduate student as he travels back to the south of 1831 to participate in Nat Turner's Rebellion, the infamous slave revolt of 1831, the failure of which resulted in even harsher and more restrictive treatment of many slaves. When his 189-year-old ancestor leads his mystical journey through time and history to the moment of crisis, he confronts his own misconceptions and stereotypes as well as his understanding of what it is to be gay and black in our modern world.

Robert O'Hara received his Directing MFA from Columbia University School of the Arts in 1996, where he wrote and directed *Insurrection: Holding History* as his Graduate Thesis. The play premiered at the New York Shakespeare Festival/Public Theater in November 1996.

Our guest speaker is **Jeremy Skidmore**, artistic director of Theater Alliance where *Insurrection* will be produced. Timothy Douglas, acclaimed director of many of August Wilson's plays, and director of Theatre Alliance's upcoming production of *Insurrection*, lighting designer Dan Covey or set designer Tony Cisek are among possible additional speakers. And our own Debbie Minter Jackson will moderate our discussion.

Ah, Wilderness! — March Play

Footlights meets on **Thursday, March 8** to discuss **Eugene O'Neill**'s only comedy, *Ah, Wilderness!* Written in 1932, the play was for O'Neill "the way I would have liked my childhood to have been." It begins on a sunny 4th of July, 1906, when O'Neill was 17. It's about a middle-class family, the Millers, and in particular the story of Richard who is going on 17, just out of high school and looking for his own independence. *Ah, Wilderness!* captures a romantic vision of the spirit of America at that time. O'Neill said it was "a play true to the spirit of the American small-town at the turn of the century."

Our guest on March 8 is **Dina Epshteyn**, Dramaturgy Fellow at Baltimore's CenterStage, and dramaturg for their upcoming production of *Ah*, *Wilderness!* Footlights' John Glynn will moderate.

After Darwin - A Footlights Greatest Hit

Usually, Footlights sees the plays we have read and discussed soon after the date of the discussion. In April, 2001, we discussed Timberlake Wertenbaker's *After Darwin*. Now's our chance to see Journeymen Theater's production.

Timberlake Wertenbaker's brain-teasing play addresses the ruling metaphor of our times: the survival of the fittest. Set in two distinct periods, *After Darwin* follows Charles Darwin traveling aboard the 'Beagle' with Robert FitzRoy into uncharted waters off the coast of South America and then, hundreds of years later, Millie, Ian and Tom as they recreate a stage version of Darwin's travels. During their staging, they uncover the polarities both in and between their own lives. *After Darwin* tackles the issue of evolution, and how we live with one another in a world

where, for many, "belief" has been replaced by a void.

We will see it on <u>Saturday, March 17, 2 p.m.</u> at the Church Street Theatre, 1742 Church Street, NW, DC. Tickets are \$15. Includes a Footlights postshow discussion.
