M. Butterfly September's Play

M. Butterfly, a Broadway hit of 1998, won the Tony Award for best play and established David Henry Hwang as a major modern American playwright. A critic writing in Time argued that "the final scene of M. Butterfly, when the agony of one soul finally takes precedence over broadranging commentary, is among the most forceful in the history of the American theater." M. Butterfly is one of the most celebrated of recent American plays, and the first by an Asian-American to win universal acclaim.

The play is based on a true story of a French diplomat who carried on a twenty-year affair with a Chinese actor and opera singer, not realizing that his partner was in fact a man masquerading as a woman. This strange story stimulated Hwang's imagination. Weaving into the play many parallels with, and ultimately ironic reversals of, Puccini's opera, *Madame Butterfly*, Hwang explores the stereotypes that underlie and distort relations between Eastern and Western culture, and between men and women. Arena Stage, where *M. Butterfly* will play from September 3 through October 17, says *M. Butterfly* is a revelation, a work of art that challenges the thresholds of human compassion and intimacy.

Footlights will meet to discuss *M. Go through the cafeteria line at La Madeleine and bring your food to the fireplace room at the back of the restaurant. Our meeting begins at 7:30 and goes no later than 9:30.

To help us better understand *M. Butterfly*, Footlights members Sybil Keats and Phyllis Bodin have arranged for

our return guest speaker, **Michelle T. Hall**, Arena's production dramaturg for *M. Butterfly*. Ms. Hall is a Washington, DC-based director, writer, dramaturg and actor. She is currently the Literary Manager and production dramaturg for Arena Stage. Michelle was nominated for two Helen Hayes Awards for co-adapting *The Desk Set* by William Marchant which was produced by The Studio Theater. Standout projects include dramaturgy for last season's *Proof* at Arena, directed by Wendy Goldberg, our guest at our dinner-discussion last October. Footlight members may remember Ms. Hall as our guest speaker for the discussion of *The Last Night of Ballyhoo*.
